

Dear Parents and Guardians,

You can support your child in finding the ideal career, or a suitable field of study for him or her. Girls' Day (Future) and Boys' Day (Future) offer orientation and guidance with this. The action days take place once-a-year in April, and pupils¹ from class 5 and upwards can take part.

The aim of the action days is for young people to try-out new things and to get to know their own strengths and talents better. Indeed, many young people can think of only a few options when choosing a profession or a course of study.

Girls tend to choose professions in which predominantly women work, such as nursing, education, sales or psychology.

Conversely, boys mainly choose professions which are almost exclusively male, such as automotive mechatronics technician, industrial clerk, painter and varnisher, or those in different areas of IT/computer science.

With these action days, young people learn about the diversity in the world of work and studies and are encouraged to look beyond their own horizons. More than 10,000 companies and institutions take part every year and offer exciting insights into everyday working life or fields of research. The young people experience the day in groups, with girls and boys each among themselves, thus making it possible to try things out, free from prejudices and clichés.

You and your child can find out more about the Girls' Day and Boys' Day professions by watching our videos in which people like Derya (industrial mechanic) and Hakan (medical technical laboratory assistant) talk about their everyday working lives and how they got their respective jobs.

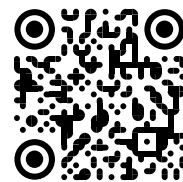
